5.	<p>Report back (from officers):</p> <p>5.1 Road safety project update Equipment has been loaned out to residents adjacent to Beauchamp Lane, Oxford – also suffering 20mph non-compliance. Miles East (South GWP) mainly construction traffic survey completed. Further survey points and repeat collection following signs still to do.</p> <p>Combined Press release to be completed soon. GWPRA Chairperson comment: “We are very pleased that all these Organisations are working together, to improve the education and information elements of the road safety campaign. This is particularly important because the GWP Roads were designed to be driven at below 20mph, in order to not be dangerous. The safety of all Residents is paramount and the GWPRA will support any such initiative which improves this”.</p> <p>Wheelie bin stickers to help support the Community Road Safety Project are now available for all Residents of GWP.
